Residents face heavy excess charges on their insurance as a result of last August's flooding which may mean that it is not worth them making a claim. However Yorkshire Water have provided some assistance with the clearing up process.



Some residents have only recently returned to their properties and are devastated that all the hard work to restore their properties has now been undone. A recent meeting of a flood forum was looking into the causes of last years flood and is seeking preventative measures.

Is a neighbour making your life a misery? You don't have to put up with it!

“Anti-social behaviour is any behaviour which causes harassment, alarm or distress to one or more people caused by other persons or people. It can include verbal abuse, vandalism, drug dealing, noise nuisance, and graffiti, and racial abuse, inappropriate use of motor vehicles, intimidation and threats of violence or actual violence”

Anti-social behaviour can have a devastating effect. It affects people's health, separates communities and can lead to the decline of neighbourhoods. Just the fear of anti-social behaviour and crime can affect the peace and well-being of local people.

What can you do to help tackle anti-social behaviour in your community?

- Try speaking to your neighbours or those causing you nuisance, sometimes people are unaware they are causing problems! **ONLY DO THIS IF YOU FEEL COMFORTABLE APPROACHING THEM.**
- Record information including, dates, times, description of incidents describing those involved, **YOU CAN DO THIS ANONYMOUSLY.** Remember to also record how this incident makes **YOU** feel!
- When an incident is happening ring the police on **0845 6060606**, or in an **emergency ring 999**. The police have also set up a dedicated answer phone line **01274 537400** to receive information about anti-social behaviour where you live. The answer phone messages are accessed daily. Detailed reports can also be made via the Worth Valley Contact Point 01535-644001 during opening hours.

Below are some explanations of phrases that are often used when dealing with Anti-Social Behaviour

Anti-Social Behaviour	Any behaviour that causes alarm, harassment or distress. Examples include shouting, fighting, vandalism and threats of violence or actual violence. It may also include drug dealing or other crimes.
Anti-Social Behaviour Orders	An Order (ASBO) is given by the Magistrates Court to stop someone behaving in an anti social way. It usually lasts for about two years and if it is breached can lead to a prison sentence or hefty fine.

In an Emergency Situation

East Anglian Ambulance Service have launched a national "In case of Emergency (ICE)" campaign with the support of Falklands war hero Simon Weston.

The idea is that you store the word "ICE" in your mobile phone address book, and against it enter the number of the person you would want to be contacted "In Case of Emergency". For more than one contact name ICE1, ICE2, ICE3 etc.

In an emergency situation ambulance and hospital staff will then be able to quickly find out who your next of kin are and be able to contact them. It's so simple that everyone can do it. Please do. Simple but effective.

There have been reports that this is a hoax but it has now been independently checked and confirmed that it is genuine.

Nuisance Diary	A diary for members of the public to write down details of Anti-Social Behaviour in their neighbourhood. It will be used to challenge people about their behaviour. It may also be used in court. THIS CAN BE DONE ANONYMOUSLY so the person in court doesn't know who has made the complaint.
Mediation	A voluntary process to settle disputes between neighbours. It gives people a chance to talk about the problems they have been having with a third party there to make sure both sides are heard. The people involved work out an agreement to end their disputes.
Hearsay Evidence	Anti-Social Behaviour is dealt with as a civil not a criminal matter. So, the evidence that is used doesn't have to be of the same standard of proof. It is possible for a Housing Officer or Enforcement Officer to take statements from residents and then present that as "hearsay evidence" on their behalf.
Acceptable Behaviour Contract	An "ABC" is a written agreement between an individual and if appropriate their housing provider (council or housing association) and the police not to behave in an anti-social manner. The agreement is NOT legally binding, but if broken can be the first stage for legal action, which may lead to an ASBO.

We are committed to tackling, not tolerating anti social behaviour in this area. By working together we can make this happen.

Parish Council Column

The Parish Council held its Annual General Meeting on 16th May. New appointments confirmed Cllr Anne Knott as the Chair of Planning with Cllr Ian Shackleton as Deputy. Cllr John Huxley was appointed Chair of the Finance Committee whilst other councillors retained their positions. At this meeting, one of the two vacancies was filled when Cllr Sam Keighley was co-opted as a member. One vacancy still remains to be filled.

A draft Charter that lays out the way we will work with Bradford Council was agreed and this will be put forward for discussion at the next Liaison meeting with Bradford Council.

This year we have set up a Parish Design Statement working group. Local people started writing our Parish Design Statement some years ago, but the group disbanded before the task could be completed. An outline statement was produced and published but the main job still to do is that of consultation with the community – in other words, we need to know your opinions on the buildings in the Parish and your views about any future building and the materials that should be used. Once this is done and the finished Statement agreed, the District Council will have to consult and respect the wishes of the Parish whenever any major planning changes, such as a future UDP (Unitary District Plan) are proposed.

Look out for dates in October for public meetings in Cross Roads, Haworth and Stanbury, where you will be welcome to give us your views.
