### Dangerous Roof Causes Closure of the Church Hall

Regrettably the St. Michael's and All Angel's Church Hall, near to the Parsonage Museum had to be closed to all users (and there are many) from January 1st. The problem is one of safety.

Following a check on one of the roof beams it became evident that the plasterboard suspended ceiling was the catching rubble from the original ceiling above it which had been crumbling for some time. This disintegration of the original ceiling was the reason that the suspended ceiling was installed some 25 - 30 years ago. On further investigation one panel broke showering rubble below and many others were bulging dangerously from the weight of the rubble.

The only safe thing to do was to suspend all use of the Hall and rip down the dangerous ceilings. This demolition has been completed exposing the rafters, a lot of electric cables and the underside of the stone slab roof. It must now be decided what will happen next and more importantly how the reparations will be paid for. It is also a safety requirement to modify the emergency lighting to meet new safety standards.

It is hoped that the hall will be back in use again as soon as possible as there are so many different groups wanting to use it, not

to mention a wedding reception booked for May. Apologies are expressed to all hall users in the meantime.

## Parish Council Column

Can I wish you all a belated, but none the less sincere, Happy New Year from all the members of your Parish Council. Our first task this January is to set the budget for the coming financial year that will run from April 1<sup>st</sup> 2005 to March 31<sup>st</sup> 2006. This is called the Precept and is the amount that will be included in the annual council tax bill for the coming year, under its own separate heading. The final figure is to be agreed at the next full Council meeting, to be held at the West Lane Baptist Chapel on Monday 31<sup>st</sup> January, starting at 7.30pm and which you all welcome to attend.

To keep you in the picture, The Parish Council Finance Committee has recommended that our basic administration costs should increase in line with inflation, although there is currently a review in progress of our Clerk's salary. Any further increase over and above this will be for additional services to benefit the community during the coming year.

To put the figures in perspective, our precept last year added a total of £10.30 to the Council Tax of a Band D property – less than 20p a week. The majority of houses in our Parish are Band A properties, who will have paid £6.87 over the year or around 13p per week. With inflation and the additional services currently under consideration, we are looking at an increase below 5% this year, which we hope you agree, offers excellent value for money.

The Group are also hoping in the near future to organise an exhibition of his-

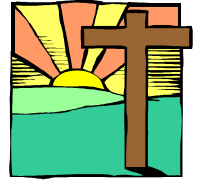
