Plans to Twin Haworth with Machu Picchu, Peru

A group has been set up to establish links with villages around the amazing "Lost city of the Incas" - Machu Picchu in Peru.

Two members of the group have just returned from a self-funded fact-finding trip to meet people in the region. Machu Picchu was chosen because it is a similar tourist-magnet and its population is close in size to Haworth. We think there will be benefits to Haworth from twinning with such a world famous centre and we will avoid becoming a charity, with benefits only going one way. Our aim is to get to know individuals and groups in Peru, learn about their aspirations and problems and look for similarities as a way of helping Haworth meet its own.

School links are planned, with email exchanges between students here learning Spanish and Machu Picchu children learning English. We also hope that libraries can be set up in each village as a way of exchanging culture and information.

On the recent trip to the village a video was taken, which shows the enthusiasm there to communicate with Haworth residents, as well as the benefits and problems that tourism can bring. 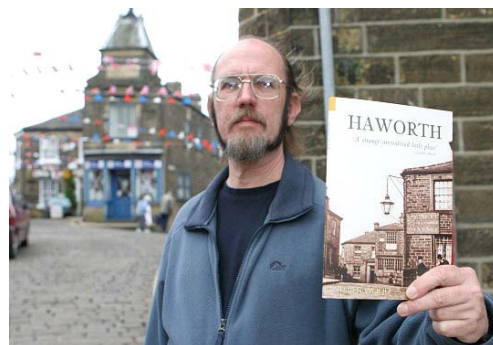

Annual Parish Meeting 2004/5, Chairman's Report

2004-5 was the first year of precepting finances for our Parish Council, following the discontinuation of the Administrative grant from Bradford Council. This resulted in an additional council tax of £9.30p for a band D dwelling.

We have made steady and prudent progress over the year, feeling our way under the new financial system. Thanks to our Clerk Glyn Broomhead the financial records of the council are up to date with the external auditors. The council has operated within budget and proceeds into the next financial year with a satisfactory reserve.

The Council met regularly throughout the year, alternating full Council and Planning Committee meetings, held at three venues; Stanbury Church, St James's Church Cross Roads, with most at West Lane Baptist Church Haworth. Notice of meetings is posted at Cross Roads Park, Stanbury Church, The Worth Valley Contact Point and the Rotary Club notice board outside the Haworth Tourist Information Centre. Notice of meetings also appears regularly in the Haworth village news section of the Keighley News.

The Parish Council hosted Neighbourhood Forum meetings in October and March and wished Area Co-ordinator Patrick Lawton well on his retirement.

During the year, we have seen the resignation of four members, Cllrs. Chris McCarthy, Chris Harris, Peter Karran and Felix Ansell whom we thank for their work on the Council. We have also welcomed two new Councillors, Beverley Watts and Philip Jolly. There are currently two vacancies, both of which we look forward to filling in the very near future.

PC Brian Woollard and PCSO Chris Pendle moved to other duties and the village is now served by PC Sheila Kirkham and PCSO Stewart Molyneux

Committees and Working Groups

The Planning Committee has met regularly, both with its own meetings and also considering planning applications as part of full Council. This committee has done a sterling job over the past year, considering and responding to all planning applications within the official timescale. A major change at the top saw the resignation of Cllr Felix Ansell as Deputy Chair of Planning and Cllr Anne Knott taking this post.

The Finance and Overview Committee, chaired during 2004 by Cllr. Peter Karran met to consider expenditure and produce the budget for 2005-6, which resulted in an increase of 4.9%. Sadly Cllr Karran resigned from the council, moving out of the area to a new job.

The Environment Working Group Chaired by Cllr. Alan Watts has made grants to local school

gardening clubs and Rotary youth club services. A lengthsman has been appointed for Stanbury and a barrow purchased for his use. Discussions are ongoing to extend the benefits of this traditional service to the rest of the parish. Discussions are in progress for improvements in Haworth Central Park.

The allotments are now owned by the Parish, but day to day management has been left with Bradford Council. Dog toilets have been left in abeyance as Bradford currently has no local service to manage this type of facility.

The Liaison Working Group chaired by Cllr. John Huxley has set parameters for better contact and information flow with bodies outside the Parish Council and reports that members of the Council have attended meetings with the Yorkshire Local Councils Assn, Haworth Village Trust, Bronte Country Partnership, Haworth in Bloom, Haworth Village Signage Group, Seminar on the Disability Discrimination Act, Seminar in Quality Councils, the Parish and Town Council Consultation Group and council members have acted as governors at all three primary schools in the parish.

The Contact Point has continued to flourish. The co-ordinator Julia Lindsey took maternity leave from August 2004 and Fiona Denby was appointed to cover. In the event, Julia decided not to return and Fiona has been confirmed in the post of co-ordinator. The Haworth Parish News, sponsored by the Parish Council has been published on a regular basis throughout the year and delivered to most households in the parish. Bradford Council has been sufficiently impressed with the Worth Valley Police and Community Contact Point that they have taken up the idea and opened three other contact points to date with the intention of extending the format into other areas in the District.

Some important events during the year

The closure of Bronte Foods saw a major employer removed from the village. This had little impact on local employment, but concerns have been raised about the suitability of the site being developed for housing, especially since the August flood.

Work to convert the old first school on Butt Lane into loft apartments was begun, with five houses built on the west side, the result of good work by the Haworth Village Trust to preserve the original facade of the building.

Cllr Ian Shackleton has been successful in gaining major funding to provide new play equipment for Cross Roads Park.

The 20mph speed limit was put into place through Stanbury village.

In August, the Mill Hey area of Haworth was badly flooded when Bridgehouse Beck burst its banks above Bridgehouse Mills. This waterway has now been taken over by DEFRA, however, residents in the affected area still have questions regarding the flooding and are seeking ways to reduce any future risk.

Autumn 2004, the Rawdon Road car park was closed and building work for the new surgery and health centre commenced on the site. This is currently expected to open at the end of 2005. £10,000 in Section 106 money from the closure of this amenity has gone to improve access to the Quarry Car Park and to provide some 27 extra parking spaces.



Gardenwise

■ Around 400 thefts of garden equipment are reported to the police each month in West Yorkshire. These offences include theft of tools, lawnmowers and furniture and ornaments.

■ How secure are yours?

■ Below are some tips to protect your property-

- ♦ Ensure that your garden's fence, walls and gates are in a good state of repair
- ♦ Install outside light—low energy dawn to dusk lighting is recommended
- ♦ Keep trees and shrubs trimmed so that thieves cannot use them as a screen to work behind—consider planting prickly plants to act as a visual and physical barrier
- ♦ If you have a garden shed it is important that it is in good condition, is fitted with a suitable lock and that any windows are secured and remember to keep the shed locked!
- ♦ All valuable property should be marked with your postcode—this acts as a deterrent to thieves and improves the chances of tracing the items if they are stolen
- ♦ Keep a photographic and written record of any valuable garden furniture or ornaments—this helps with tracing the items in the event they are stolen and is a way of proving ownership
