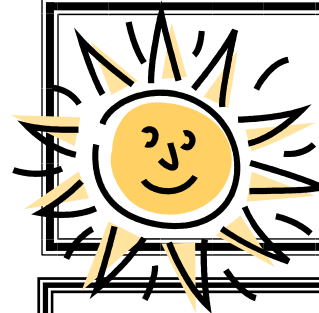

## WORTH VALLEY COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

The Worth Valley Speedwatch is about to be launched in our area.

The idea behind the scheme is to promote a safer environment free from speeding vehicles. The aim is to identify areas where speeding vehicles are an issue, to monitor the speed and record the details of the offenders vehicle, and forward this onto the police.

Initially warning letters will be sent to the offenders, but continued offending will lead to monitoring by the police and then prosecution.

Community Speedwatch is run by volunteers whose aim is to promote safer speeds, increase safety and educate and reassure the general public.

We are all concerned for safer roads in our areas and we must support their involvement.

## Parish Council Column

I am happy to report a successful meeting between the Parish Council Flood Action Plan Committee, Mr Tony Poole, Flood Officer for Bradford Council and residents and business owners from Mill Hey who agreed proposals put by Bradford Council to minimise the risk of flooding in the area.

These included raising the road level to remove the low point outside the Royal Oak; replacing the flood doors on the bridge, improving drainage from the Gas St Car Park, with an emergency overflow into the river, plus a plan to divert surface water from Brow side into the river via River St.

The new Doctors Surgery will be open by the time you read this and although it has its critics, it was by far the best looking of the three tenders for the project. Your Parish Council had some input and helped to ensure the window surrounds were stone, not aluminium; the ventilation ducts were made to look like chimneys and the building was largely in York stone. The real advantage to this building will be better medical care for us all.

Talking medical matters, we still require a few more volunteers for our First Responders team. After full training, First Responders attend a range of medical emergencies in the area until the ambulance service arrives. Volunteers need a telephone, their own transport and be willing to devote time for training and to be on call for a few hours a week. The area covered is Oxenhope, Haworth, Cross Roads, Stanbury and Oakworth. If you wish to know more, give me a call.

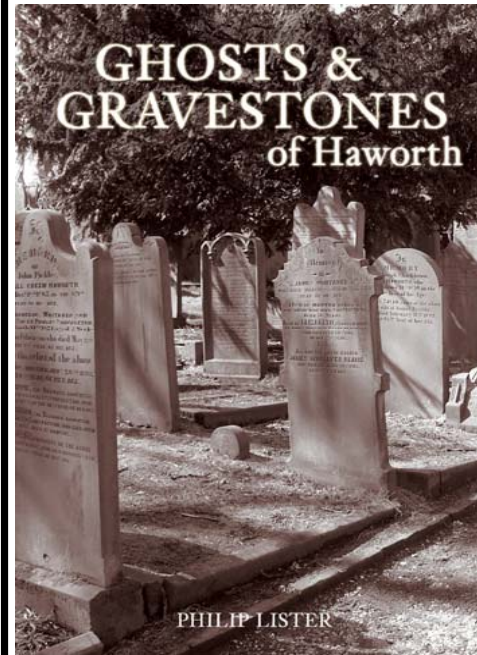

## HAWORTH RAMBLERS CENTENARY WALK

On 1st September 1906 Haworth Ramblers had their first walk. They left Stanbury at teatime and walked to The Ridge where they had sandwiches. The walk continued by moonlight through Hardcastle Crags and back over Cock Hill to Haworth.



To mark the centenary of this event, the Upper Worth Valley History Group is planning to repeat part of the walk on Saturday 2nd September. Starting at Hob Hill, the Stanbury bus terminus at 9.45am (the 664 bus 9.15am from Keighley, 9.29am Haworth KWVR Station, will get you there in time), the walk will take you via Top Withens, Walshaw Dean, Blake Dean and Hardcastle Crags to Hebden Bridge, where you will catch the 4.30pm bus back to Haworth.

Stout boots and appropriate clothing should be worn, and a packed lunch will be required. The walk is 10 miles long and some stretches are steep. Well behaved dogs on leads welcome.

## BOGUS CALLERS



Before you open the door, check to see who it is by looking through your front window, or by using a door viewer if you have one.

Only open the door when you have put the chain on.

Get a good look at their clothing – some official callers will have a uniform bearing their company organisation or logo. But remember that a uniform alone doesn't make the caller genuine – also ask to see proof of identity, genuine callers will carry an identification card, usually displaying their photograph.

Utility services may operate a password system – contact your local branch to find out more.

Suggest that the caller should come back later, especially if they have no appointment. You can then check their story by telephoning the organisation or company they claim to represent.

Check any telephone number the caller gives you in your own telephone directory. Do not rely on any number offered by the caller – it may be the number of a partner in crime.

Always lock the back door before opening the front door, or vice versa. Bogus callers sometimes work in pairs – one caller could be distracting you at the front whilst the other sneaks in round the back. Beware of callers who attempt to distract you by claiming they have seen something untoward in your back garden or somewhere that may encourage you to leave your house.

Let the Police and your neighbours know if you have had a suspicious caller at the door.

Locks and chains are only a deterrent if they are used!!

Emergency situations can arise. Do not leave the door chain on all the time as this may cause a delay – only put the door chain on before answering the door.

Remember – **IF IN DOUBT, KEEP THEM OUT!!**
