### Chairman's Annual Report 2006

As we complete our second year of precepting for finance, we can report that the external auditing of the accounts is up to date and the Council has operated within its budgets and is in a good financial condition.

The Council has met regularly throughout the year on a six weekly format with a planning meeting between each full Council. Meetings have been held at three venues: Stanbury Church, St James Church Cross Roads and West Lane Baptist Church in Haworth. Notices of meeting are posted at Cross Roads Park, Stanbury Church, The Rotary Club notice board at the Tourist Information Centre Main St and the Worth Valley Police & Community Contact Point. Notice of meetings also appears regularly in the village section of the Keighley News.

At the start of the year, Councillors Peter Hill and John Huxley were elected Chairman and Vice Chair respectively. Cllr Anne Knott was confirmed as Chair of the Planning Committee. Other appointments were as follows: Finance & Overview Committee – Cllr John Huxley. Environment Working Group - Cllr Alan Watts. Communications Working Group - Cllr Ian Palmer, Liaison Working Group – Cllr John Huxley, QC Status Working Group – Cllr Peter Hill, Village Design Statement Working Group – Cllr Peter Hill

At this meeting we welcomed Sam Keighley as a new member of the Council. We also received the first draft of the proposed Charter between Bradford and the Parishes. An agreement was reached with Keighley Town Council to share the cost of the paid Worker at the Contact Point, should a Contact Point project be successful in Oakworth.

At the first meeting of the Village Design Statement group, Cllr Hill suggested Cllr Huxley take over the chair, due to his prior work on this project. With the VDS no longer having weight in the planning process, it was decided to incorporate the work to date on the VDS and related projects into a full Parish Plan.

In June, the Housing needs survey was presented to Council by Bradford Rural Housing Enablers, outlining the current and future needs for housing in the Parish. On June 8<sup>th</sup>, the Council held a flood action plan meeting to discuss how best to minimise the damage to property in Mill Hey and other areas of the village due to flooding. A Flood Action Plan (FLAP) Committee was formed. Haworth was again flooded on July 12<sup>th</sup>.

Chairman's Report continued.....

On July 20<sup>th</sup> the Contact point held an open day to celebrate three years of successful operation. Contact Point Coordinator Fiona Denby tendered her resignation which was accepted with regret. Later in the year we welcomed her replacement, Hilary Healey.

July saw a joint meeting and Neighbourhood Forum at which the problem of school places for local children was once again debated, this time with Mr. Martin Jackson of Education Bradford. In Council, Keighley Town Councillor Graham Mitchell on behalf of the Bronte Country Partnership presented the proposal for a Haworth travel plan, which was welcomed by members.

At the September meeting, applications for grants were received from Mike Hutchinson for a Beadle/Criers outfit for village events. Requests for contributions were received from Cross Roads Gala Committee and also from the Fair Trade Group for its twinning event with Machu Picchu in Peru.

In October, the Parish Council meeting once again hosted the Neighbourhood Forum, which discussed the Haworth Travel Plan, recycling and Community relations. On October 21<sup>st</sup>, Chairman Peter Hill on behalf of the Parish Council and the Lord Mayor of Bradford Councillor Valerie Binney, signed the twinning document with Machu Picchu.

On the 17<sup>th</sup> November, a FLAP meeting was held to hear good news from City Council Portfolio Holder Anne Hawkesworth that Mill Hey in Haworth was to be included for remedial flooding works in the district.

In December, the Council heard a proposal from Feast to hold monthly farmers markets in Haworth. This report was welcomed with a venue and any permission required to be researched. The official opening of the Oakworth Contact point was held on December 13<sup>th</sup> with open sessions to the public starting in January. Under the umbrella of the Parish Council and Bradford Parks Service a pilot meeting was held for a friends of the park group.

At the 30<sup>th</sup> January meeting, a precept was approved for the year 2006-7 of £13.18p per annum for a band D Property, raising a total precept of £29,250 for the year. Lee Gray of First Responders presented the idea of forming a group in the Worth Valley, centred upon Haworth. As a rural community, we receive the equipment for a First Reponders scheme free and with grants from Oxenhope PC and the Oakworth Urban Village Project, it was agreed to set the scheme in motion and canvas for volunteers. We also heard from representatives of the Youth Service who outlined their duties and promised to present a plan for youth work in the parish at a later meeting.

For the March meeting, we welcomed Barry Thorne to the Council, co-opted to fill the last vacancy. Our clerk Glyn Broomhead was thanked for arranging new gates to be fitted at Stanbury Park.

In March, Bronte Country Partnership and Richard Armitage Associates published the Haworth Travel Plan, to be presented to the Parish Council at the next meeting.



## Committee Reports

### **Finance and Overview Committee**

The Finance and Overview Committee has had a busy and productive year. We have staged three quarterly meetings and one emergency meeting during which we have overseen the Council's financial performance and introduced a number of policies for grant requests. These policies are designed to meet the Council's responsibilities to parishioners in the three villages; provide necessary financial backing to organisations that underpin many activities within the Council's area of responsibilities and, importantly, maintain a total transparency of operation. Although there was a significant increase in the Parish Council Precept for 2006-07, we believe that parishioners will receive full value for their money and an improved quality of life in the villages as a result.

### **Parish Plan Group**

During the last 12 months the Group has re-focussed from its work of delivering a Parish Design Statement to undertaking the far bigger project of creating a Parish Plan, which will include the Design Statement. Initially we had hoped to deliver the completed statement by July 2006 but, following more detailed investigations into the work required to deliver the final document, the Group is now looking at a project that could take between 18 months to two years to complete. The Plan remains, we believe, crucial for the future of the Parish and to maintain their voices in the corridors of local power. We expect to bring forward a time-line planning document in the next few weeks which will plot our way through the workload successfully.

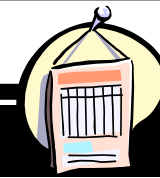
## TWIN TOWN IS NOT THE WEAKEST LINK!

It is 6 months since the official signing of the Friendship Agreement between Haworth and the village sometimes known as Aguas Calientes, the village at the foot of the world famous Inca citadel of Machu Picchu. Since then work has been continuing, to build strong links between the schools and people of the villages.
