## HAWORTH - AS WE SEE IT!



This is simply to say "Thank you" to all who made the art installation at the Black Bull at the top of Haworth's Main Street such an incredible success. We have been involved in many community art projects over the years but this was on our own doorstep.... and it has proven to be the very best.

We received a 'Community Champions' grant from the Scarman Trust for £1,833 to cover the purchase cost of materials, distribution and launch. We spent £2,130 ish ..... but... such is life!

Our design was based around a frame-work built by local builders ... but a sudden rush of emergency work meant that they were unavailable so we had to design and build the frame-work ourselves. Of the 100 canvasses given out, 98 were returned. This represents our highest ever success rate. The installation was never intended to be illuminated at night as this would be cost-prohibitive, but, out of the blue, we received an offer from an internationally renowned lighting designer to illuminate it for free if we did the donkey-work. An offer that could not be refused !

90 exhibitors agreed to sell their canvasses for charity so we arranged an 'Auction Night'. By this time we had used up all of the grant but The 'Haworth Tea Rooms' and the 'Black Bull' came to the rescue by putting on a free buffet that would have satisfied the Biblical 5,000 and local businesses gave lots of prizes for a raffle. The auction night itself was almost beyond belief. The 90 works offered for sale raised over £1,550 for local charities Haworth Riding for the Disabled, Manorlands Hospice and the P.D.S.A.

In all over 250 local people were involved in the project and we have a list of over 150 individuals who wish to take part next year...should we be able to find funding. If we run our event before (or after) the summer school holidays, we can involve many more 'local' groups ... schools, scouts, brownies, etc ... what do you think? We have been overwhelmed by the support that we have received from the people of Haworth and really cannot thank you enough.

We LOVE this village.

## Parish Council Column

Three cheers for the Haworth in Bloom Committee and the school Gardening Club who both scooped Gold in this year's Yorkshire in Bloom awards. As well as beautifying the village and teaching our young folk the pleasures of gardening, we can all feel good, as part of your Parish Council tax supports these groups; a clear case where local money is locally spent to everyone's benefit. It is worth remembering that we also support gardening clubs at Stanbury and Cross Roads primary schools. Another success, The Friends of Haworth Park are also celebrating winning the coveted Green Flag award for the second year running.

The Parish Council has approved a budget of £200 for a new village notice board in Stanbury. The PC is also campaigning for a new bus shelter in Stanbury and an improved stopping place at Cross Roads Park. Also, we have not forgotten the request for a bus shelter on West Lane, despite having been refused in the past.

At our July meeting, visiting speakers included Neil Stoddart, who outlined the new healthy eating programme for schools and Tony Poole, the Bradford MBC drainage officer who explained the background as to why the 2006 EC funding scheme could only be part completed. However, the work done seems to have been effective, as despite the wettest summer for many years and widespread flooding across the country, the dwellings most at risk on Mill Hey have remained dry. Our final speaker was Inspector Mark Allsop who confirmed that a new PCSO Emily Dean has been recruited for the Worth Valley.

The Parish Council has received a number of reports of speeding in our villages, anti-social parking on pavements and parking on Mill Hey. Can I ask all motorists to obey the speed limits in the Parish and to park with care so pedestrians can use the pavements. Please remember that there is 30 minutes free parking at Gas Street car park, so there is no excuse for parking on the double yellow lines on Mill Hey. As a word of warning, I understand that the police will be keeping a close eye on these problems in coming months.

# USING PUBLIC TRANSPORT

The chances of being attacked whilst using public transport in West Yorkshire are very unlikely. Nevertheless, you can take additional simple measures to ensure your safety.

### TOP TIPS

- \* Avoid isolated bus stops - walk to a stop that is well lit or less deserted.
- \* On an empty bus, sit near the driver.
- \* On trains avoid sitting in deserted compartments.
- \* If you are harassed whilst travelling on a bus or train, report it to the driver or guard if you feel it is safe to do so, and report it to the Police.
- \* Always book taxis in advance and ask them to give your name when they arrive.
- \* If you feel vulnerable when arriving home in a taxi, ask the driver to wait until you are inside the house.
- \* Carry a personal attack alarm and use it if you are confronted.

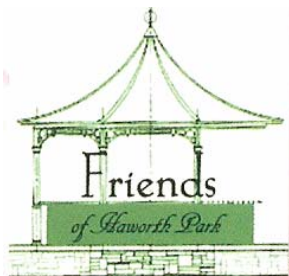

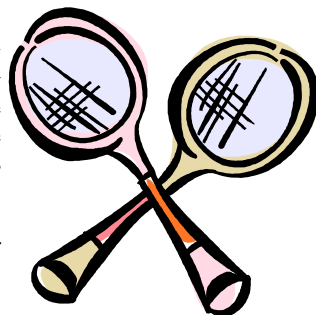

## REMEMBER, REMEMBER THE 5TH OF NOVEMBER

Bonfire Night will soon be upon us and fireworks are a traditional part of enjoying the celebrations; but they are the cause of many hundreds of serious accidents every year and it should be remembered that they are dangerous explosives. The safest way to enjoy them is to go to a professionally organised event but if you are having your own party, please follow the advice from the West Yorkshire Fire Service.

A firework display should be an enjoyable occasion for everyone, but the hazards of fireworks and bonfires should not be underestimated. Follow these rules for a safe display.

The Firework Code:

1. Buy fireworks marked BS 7114.
2. Keep fireworks in A CLOSED BOX, e.g., a biscuit tin. Take them out one at a time and put the lid back on at once.
3. Follow the instructions on each firework carefully - read them by torchlight. Never a naked flame!
4. Light end of firework fuse at arms length - preferably with a safety firework lighter or fuse wick.
5. Never throw fireworks!
6. Stand well back.
7. Never return to a firework once lit - it may go off in your face!
8. Never put fireworks in your pocket!
9. Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
10. Never give sparklers to a child under five.
11. Keep pets indoors.



Note: It is an offence to discharge a firework in a street or public place. (The Explosives Act 1875 (Section 80) and The Town Police Clauses Act 1847 (Section 28).

If you intend to have a bonfire as well, it should not be lit before the firework display is finished unless the firework display is sufficiently far away to ensure that stray sparks from the bonfire cannot fall into the firework area.

- Don't light in windy conditions.
- Don't leave it unattended. Someone should have the time to supervise it until it has burned out - if it has to be left dampen it down.
- Build it well clear of buildings, garden sheds, the firework display area, fences and hedges (at least 18 metres (60 ft)).
- Keep a fire beater and a bucket of water or hosepipe handy just in case.
- Never put fireworks onto bonfires even if they are dead.
- Check construction before lighting to ensure no animal or child is inside.
- Never burn dangerous rubbish - aerosols, paint tins, bottles, batteries, tyres or foam furniture.
- Use domestic firelighters to start the bonfire.
- Never use flammable liquids to start the fire.
