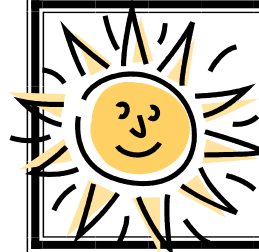

HAWORTH ARTS FESTIVAL 2008

This annual event has adopted a new title and will now be known as The Haworth Arts and Music Festival. The word ‘music’ has been added to reflect its importance in the festival line-up. Headlining at the 2008 Festival will be internationally renowned jazz musician Snake Davis and popular Yorkshire poet Ian McMillan. And, after a tremendous reception two years ago, Haworth Main Street will again be the venue for a display of Parcour, the aerobic sport similar to Freerunning and there will be a workshop for anyone wishing to try it for themselves.

Also returning after going down a storm (and discovering real ale on the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway!) will be musicians from the Nyah Festival held in County Cavan, Ireland every year - a keystone of traditional Irish music events. This continues an exchange of artists which saw local folk artist Tim Moon take part in the Nyah Festival in March to great acclaim. Other bookings include local bands, arts workshops and the return of the Blues Café; also in the mix will be poetry and books, community music projects and storytelling.

The Haworth Arts Group who coordinate the Festival are looking for funding ideas and sponsorship from local businesses. Please get in touch via the website if you have ideas or money to offer.

Parish Council Column

The way we live in our three Pennine hill villages is changing. The Parish Council Planning Committee's workload is ample testimony to the trends that are not only sweeping our particular corner of West Yorkshire but nationally too. The need for more housing has been identified by the Government and we as Parish Councillors have been caught up in the consultation process as Bradford Council considers how their district will absorb the 20,000 houses the national targets require them to allow before 2026.

There are no easy answers, particularly when you take a look round our own district and see the number of old mills being targeted by developers for alteration into apartments and mill yards used as new-build housing sites while every other little corner of available land seems to be going under the bulldozer for yet more apartments or houses.

Some of the developments will improve the village from the point of view that old, dilapidated buildings are given new appearances and life. Some other developments are less desirable from the perspective of the people who already live in the villages. But the major question for us all to ponder is how the infrastructure e.g. roads, sewers, schools and medical facilities etc., is going to cope under the ever-increasing demand from both Government and developers? That question seems to be receiving scant attention and the answer may seriously trouble future generations if we are not careful.

Rest assured your interests and views are being relayed into the information-gathering process by the Parish Council and we hope to have a further influence on how our lives are affected when we publish the Parish Plan. The Plan's long, exhaustive consultation process is now complete and the Steering Group is now about to start compiling the document. Then when the document is lodged everybody from the Prime Minister to Bradford Council will be able to see just how we feel about the way our communities are developed.

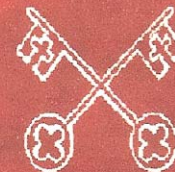

SNEAK-IN BURGLARY



Sneak in Burglary can only occur when a property has been left insecure. Usually the burglar enters through an unlocked door or window.

Sneak-in burglaries account for almost 1 in 4 of all burglaries in West Yorkshire, and all of them can be prevented at no cost to the resident, other than taking an extra minute to secure doors and windows.

Sneak-in burglary - Top Tips

- ◆ Keep all doors and windows locked (even when you are in)
- ◆ Keep valuable items, such as car keys, credit cards, wallets, handbags, jewellery etc. out of sight
- ◆ Report any suspicious activity to the Police

By taking these simple steps you will greatly reduce the chance of becoming a victim of crime.

DON'T BECOME THE VICTIM OF A PHONE SCAM!



We have had reports recently of residents who have received phone calls from people pretending to be calling from BT. The residents have been addressed by name, and then have been told that they have an outstanding balance on their BT account, which, if it is not paid immediately, will result in their phone being cut off.

Trading Standards and West Yorkshire Police have now been told about these calls. It seems that the callers are hoping to get credit card details from unsuspecting members of the public for fraudulent use.

You may also be receiving emails which appear to be from banks and building societies asking you to confirm your bank details. These too are fraudulent and you should not reply to them.

Trading Standards advise that you should never give bank account details, credit card details or any other personal information to people you don't know, either over the phone or via the internet.
