Entertainment in the Park Project Update November 2008



"When are we going to see something happening?" we hear you ask. Thanks to the financial state of things in the country at present, we are struggling a bit as you can imagine. However we are still beavering away and are making headway with the project. Thanks to the letter we received in May concerning the size of the proposed Performing Arts Structure, the council applied, and received revised planning permission; that did away with the plinth so that performers can spill out on to the surround if need be. English Heritage and the Conservation department weren't keen on the overall size being increased, not to mention the increase in cost. It also removes the need for a disabled access ramp and railings. This hasn't reduced the cost

as the world wide colossal rise in the price of steel has swallowed up any reduction there would have been. We are now looking at £150,000 as the final total. This includes VAT, legal expenses, emergency contingency (needs that the people in the know say we need to account for), and inflation. We were shocked and dismayed when originally we received this latest quote, but have been assured that this is attainable, and reflects the quality of the proposed project. We were hoping to start work on the base this summer but have been told that if we spend the money raised so far, it will not count towards match funding from outside funding bodies. Don't ask us, we didn't write the rules, but that is how it works.

What's next?

We are now applying to all the major funding bodies that we have researched. We have completed the Power Point Presentation that we have been working on all summer, and getting the facts compiled and checked before going 'live' with it. We will be sending it out to key business people in the village, also to key Yorkshire based big businesses that support local endeavours, but anyone wishing to have a copy, please apply to the Contact Point at Changegate who will pass on your request to us. Our bandstand collection boxes are out again around the village. Please pop small change in whenever you can, you will surprised how it mounts up.

Parish Council Column

Planning is an essential part of life. It doesn't matter whether it's just deciding what time to go shopping or where and when you're going on holiday; there is always a need to project into the future. The Parish Council is no different. Three years ago it picked up on Government policy to formulate a Parish Plan and set the wheels in motion to put a Plan in place for our three villages.

The Parish Council handed the compilation task to the Haworth, Cross Roads and Stanbury Parish Plan Steering Committee and they busied themselves by consulting with as many residents as possible through consultation meetings and a questionnaire and then holding meetings with special interest groups such as the business community, youth groups, senior citizen groups, sports clubs and arts groups.

The consultation process was finished by late summer this year and, once the data analysis was completed, a first draft was produced. Now the Steering Committee is putting the finishing touches to the final version of the Parish Plan and the planned launch date is early in the New Year.

If the Parish Plan was an important project before the arrival of the Credit Crunch, and financial crisis we're currently enduring, then it is doubly important to our communities that the Steering Committee's work is lodged with Bradford Council and other agencies as soon as possible.

Given so many other uncertainties in the modern world, it's crucial that we have something solid around which to plan the future not just for ourselves but for the succeeding generations. The consultation has indentified so many issues we need to address if not now, certainly during the next few years. With the need for financial constraint now paramount, the Parish Plan will aid the people responsible for the delivery of services and for ensuring the quality of our lives to identify what we as a community consider to our main priorities.

Given that this is our last newsletter before Christmas may I on behalf of everybody at Haworth, Cross Roads and Stanbury Parish Council take this opportunity of wishing you all a very Happy Christmas and the hope that 2009 sees stability, peace and prosperity restored to our villages. JOHN HUXLEY

CLEAR CAR CAMPAIGN

- Don't leave anything on display in your car. Even an old coat on the back seat is a temptation for someone to "smash and grab" - they steal first and think about value later.
- ◆ Take all your belongings with you when you leave the car. If you can't, lock them in the boot, preferably before you start your journey.
- Never leave any of the following on display in your car as they are all attractive to car thieves: mobile phones, laptop computers, credit and debit cards, cheque books, cash, vehicle documents, private mail (especially with your address on it), and especially at this time of year, Christmas presents.

COMPUTER CLASSES



Are you having a new digital camera this Christmas? Are your grandchildren getting a new computer? Learn new skills or brush up on what you already know at the ever popular classes organised by the Contact Point for CALTEC.



We hope to run a class for complete beginners, a Microsoft Applications class to help you get more from Word, Excel and other Microsoft packages, a certificated course for those who wish to improve their current knowledge and get a formal qualification and a digital photography class to help you make the most of your camera.

Classes will run for 9 weeks - on January 6th, 13th, 20th and 27th, and March 3rd, 10th, 17th, 24th and 31st. There may be extra classes for those on the Certificated course to help them achieve their goal - if so the cost will be an extra £2 per week, plus the £2 for room hire. The cost for each course will be £36, plus a £5 registration fee if you are enrolling on a new course. Both these amounts are payable "up-front" and there is an additional charge of £2 per week payable towards the cost of the room hire.

Classes are held in West Lane Baptist Church. Beginners classes are usually held on a Monday afternoon from 2.00 - 4.00pm. Microsoft Applications classes are usually on Tuesdays from 9.15 - 11.15am, followed by Digital Pohography from 12.00 - 2.00pm and the Certificated Course from 2.15 - 4.15pm. Days and times are subject to change depending on enrolments.


