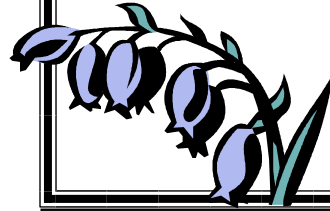

FOOD FOR LIFE



Haworth Primary School has been selected to become national leader on school meals and food education.

The school will become one of 180 Flagship Schools and Communities across England that will be recognised as national leaders on food quality and food education. Haworth Primary School is one of the first 6 schools to be chosen in the Yorkshire and Humber region.

Taking up the challenge laid down by Jamie Oliver's school dinners campaign, the Food for Life Partnership has been funded by the National Lottery over five years from 2007 to help transform food culture in schools across the country.

Building on Haworth Primary School's achievements to date, the Food for Life Partnership will now help them put more fresh, local & organic food on the menu and get pupils – and interested parents and community groups – cooking and growing food and visiting local farms.

Gardening Club Leader Steve Thorpe said "I feel really excited for everyone at our school about becoming a flagship school. Although we have come a long way over the past 5 years I still believe the journey has only just begun. It is good that the Food for Life Partnership has picked a project that is already up and running and proving so successful. This will show others what can be done and achieved and we will be able to give so much help and advice along the way"

Headteacher Janet Parkinson said: "I am delighted that the school and Steve Thorpe have been recognised for pioneering work with Gardening that has impacted on the curriculum and has contributed to the development of a forward looking Food Culture in school. We are really excited about developing cookery skills both in school and the community and further improving the quality of school meals."

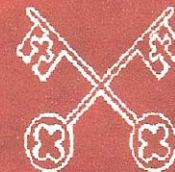

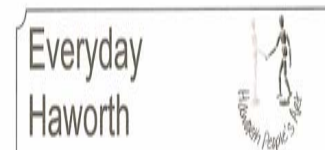

GARDENWISE TOP TIPS

- ◆ Ensure that your garden's fence, walls and gates are in a good state of repair.
- ◆ Install outside lighting - low energy dusk to dawn lighting is recommended.
- ◆ Keep trees and shrubs trimmed so that thieves cannot use them as a screen to work behind; consider planting 'prickly' plants, such as a Pyracantha, to act as a visual deterrent as well as a physical barrier.
- ◆ If you have a garden shed it is important that it is in a good condition, is fitted with a suitable lock and any windows are secured - remember to keep the shed locked!
- ◆ All valuable property should be marked with your postcode - this acts as a deterrent to thieves and improves the chances of tracing the items if they are stolen.
- ◆ Keep a photographic and written record of any valuable garden furniture or ornaments - this helps with tracing the items if they are stolen and is a way of confirming ownership.

"Everyday Haworth" is the title of this year's major art event at the Black Bull and The Souk on Haworth Main Street. Building upon the success and goodwill of last year's "Haworth ... as WE see it" picture wall outside the Black Bull, this year's event will be larger and even more amazing!



200 canvasses and paint sets will be freely distributed around the village and the recipients asked to paint any aspect of everyday life in Haworth, showing that alongside the Bronte past, our village is a real place with real people in it and has so much to offer in the present day. Once all the pictures have been returned they will be fixed to a huge outdoor framework for all to see. Once again the installation will be illuminated at night.

Sandra and Chris McCarthy who organised last year's event are also behind this one, but with a difference. Mel and James from the Black Bull, and Rosie and Glyn Broomhead have joined them to form an organising group. This group is called "Haworth People's Art" and will concentrate solely upon organising an annual community based event, involving only local people.

This year's event will be launched on Saturday July 19th, with live music throughout the day and an evening switch-on of the lights. The picture wall itself will remain in place for two weeks.

This is a free event, organised by and for people who want to give back something to the village we love.
