£3million New Community Centre in Haworth

As we go to print Bradford Council's Executive Committee is being asked to fund the building of a new £3.1million centre in Haworth for the Worth Valley!

If agreed the new centre will include a library (open 30hours per week), a new community centre with hall, bar and meeting rooms, and a Children's Centre with workers to support local families with children under 5.

The centre will be located on the current Tennis Courts at the junction of Rawdon Road and Butt Lane, with the tennis Courts being rebuilt on a new site. It has been long agreed that the area needs a permanent library to meet government requirements, Haworth was agreed as the best location for a children's Centre by a council meeting some weeks ago and the Community Centre has long needed a complete refurbishment with many plans being proposed over the years.

It is hoped that a new building, built in partnership will ensure that the sharing of facilities and services will ensure that the centre can be built to the best specification and will be financially viable for its life span.

Parish Council Column

Have you ever wondered what would happen if you felt threatened? Also, have you ever thought what you would do if something went seriously wrong in your district? Well, you would more than likely call the Police. A few years ago you might have had to wait a bit because Police in this neck of woods were definitely thin on the ground. Today we're well served by West Yorkshire Police, in comparative terms. As from January 12 we have a police sergeant, two police constables and several community officers on our neighbourhood team and help is much nearer at hand. Of course, it is possible to argue even those numbers are not enough but, in real terms, Haworth, Cross Roads and Stanbury are peaceable, secure places in which to live and bring up children. There has been a substantial reduction in crime during the last decade and, while it would be good to see a complete elimination of that ill from our society, we all know that ambition is just not realistic or possible.

The recent re-organisation in Bradford district policing means that our security is controlled by a team based at Bingley. Operational reasons have quite clearly meant that it is better to do it from that part of the Aire Valley rather than Keighley. Of course it's natural to be concerned because the headquarters of our neighbourhood team has been moved further away but I suppose the proof of the pudding is in the eating. So far the meal has been satisfying.

When PC Graham Jessop left the valley as one of our PCs we felt unsure. Graham had been such an important part of settling disputes, solving crimes and keeping a lid on potential incidents that we wondered what was to happen next. Now that the Worth Valley neighbourhood team is back up to full strength following the arrival of PC Cath Gallimore in January we hope that they can build on the freedom from serious crime we enjoy and use their skills to nip other troubles in the bud.

At the Parish Council we have expressed real fears about inconsiderate parking outside our schools as well as speeding motorists racing up and down our rural roads. We have asked that the officers pay special attention to these matters in the earnest hope that we can prevent a needless death or serious injury and we await the results of their efforts.

In the meantime we wish you all a Happy New Year and best wishes for 2009.

The Worth Valley Neighbourhood Police Team (NPT) have recently published the latest priority crime figures for Haworth, covering the period 1st October 2008 - 31st December 2008. They are:

Robbery	1
Theft from motor vehicle	2
Burglary dwelling	3
Theft of motor vehicle	4
Criminal damage	12

Total priority crime - 22 offences in 3 months.

Sergeant Wheeler of the Worth Valley NPT said " The latest figures are very encouraging indeed. The Christmas period and darker nights tend to see a rise in the number of house burglaries, so we are pleased that our work in the area has ensured that crime has remained low, with only 3 house burglaries in 3 months. Along with extra high visibility patrols we have target hardened many properties and issued free a large number of energy saving light bulbs and timers, so that residents can work alongside us in preventing crime".

Haworth Cat Rescue is urging everyone to get behind their mascot Haworth, the ginger tom in the charity's logo, and be part of his 2009 'In for a Pound' campaign towards the construction of a new eco-friendly rehoming centre in the Aire Valley.

The enlarged facility will enable Haworth Cat Rescue to expand its educational and rehoming activities and provide more paid employment and increased volunteering opportunities for people of all ages and abilities.

In 2008 the charity rehomed 392 cats but has a long waiting list and local demand for its services now exceeds capacity by two thirds.

"With the current economic climate, pressure on our services is increasing. We provide comfort and reassurance through our no-kill promise to individuals and families forced to surrender their beloved pet due to changes in their circumstances such as home repossession," said Corinne.

The Facts about Carbon Monoxide (CO)

CO may be emitted from any faulty cooking or heating appliance powered by any fuel that burns (gas, coal, oil, wood etc.).

Human senses cannot pick up CO which another reason it is so dangerous.

To prevent deaths and injuries from CO and other fuel toxins:

1. All appliances powered by any fuel that burns should be serviced according to manufacturer's instructions – usually once a year. Make sure that the person doing this work is properly qualified – it's your money and your life. With gas the installer must be CORGI registered until 1st April 2009 when they must be Gas Safe Registered.
2. Make sure all chimneys and flues are regularly swept and checked.
3. Ensure adequate ventilation and don't block ventilation grilles.
4. As an extra safeguard against CO, buy a CO alarm to European Standards. This will cost around £20 in most good DIY stores and some supermarkets.

In an emergency, ring the Gas Emergency Service line on 0800111999 but they will only turn off your appliance or your gas. Seek immediate medical help and insist on a CO test. Ordinary blood is adequate for this – there is NO NEED for arterial blood.
