**When should I call 101?**

To report less urgent incidents and for general police enquiries. For example:

- Reporting a crime
- Reporting anti-social behaviour
- Reporting information to the police

**How does it work?**

**What does it cost?**

All calls to 101 only cost 15pence, even from your mobile, and no matter what time of day or how long your call.

**Can I call 101 if I'm deaf, hard of hearing, speech impaired, or if English is not my first language?**

Yes, if you are deaf, or speech impaired you can text phone 18001 101.

If you have difficulty speaking English, your local police can access interpreters who can translate your call.

## **PARISH COUNCIL COLUMN**

Your Council doesn't employ many people, two in fact, and next Spring we shall be losing one of them, our clerk Glyn Broomhead, who is retiring after eight years in post.

Glyn is not only the clerk to the Council but he is also our Responsible Financial Officer who is the guardian of our finances. During his time working with the Council he has been the rock around which we have based our operations.

Being a clerk to a council such as ours is not a full-time post but it is still a key appointment and we will undoubtedly find him difficult to replace as it is a very responsible position. The process of seeking his successor has already started and advertisements seeking suitably qualified applicants are being placed within the locally-based media. As we are a Quality Status Council Glyn's successor will have to be suitably qualified, or in a position to become qualified within a short space of time, because that is one of the key indicators in retaining that hard-won registration.

One of Glyn's qualities has been his willingness to be available whenever the Councillors are meeting and to deliver those out-of-office hours services that are so important to a community organisation such as ours.

On the business front the Parish Council has made its feelings known to the Boundaries Commission concerning their proposal to place the Worth Valley in a newly-formed Parliamentary Constituency focused on the Calder Valley. Residents are also encouraged to give the Boundaries Commission their opinions and the best way of doing that is by going to their web site and clicking on the feedback sector. If you don't have access to the internet, you can get their address by checking with the Contact Point.

Bradford Council's proposed Local Development Framework document was published recently and perhaps the greatest shock was that it proposes that Haworth will need to provide land for 600 homes up until 2025.

To say that this was a shock was an understatement and that clearly has major issues for our village, virtually doubling its size during the life of the Framework.

Our Council has committed to working up a Local Development Plan which I would anticipate would deliver a far lower figure for anticipated housing and it will be interesting to see which target is finally adopted.

We shall be participating in all the necessary consultation processes and we would be interested to receive the views of any resident as part of our desire to truly reflect the residents' views.

**WILDLIFE CRIME IN OAKWORTH**

Three males were sighted entering woodland in the Oakworth area with dogs and spades in the afternoon of Friday the 21st October 2011.

The officer was very suspicious of this activity believing their intention was to disturb or interfere with badger setts. On approaching the woods only two males remained at the scene with one dog. Both covered in soil and gave a poor explanation as to why they were there were cautioned and reported for offences under the Protection of Badgers Act 1992 and Hunting Act 2004. Wild animals and birds are protected by many acts of law and your local Police will always act on any information they receive in order to apprehend persons breaking these laws. Any information can be given anonymously to Crimestoppers quoting Operation Meles. A operation plan set up by West Yorkshire Police to protect the persecution of badgers. With your help we can make a difference.

**Farmwatch to the rescue! - 7th November**

Farmwatch proved very useful in an unusual way for one local resident. Police were contacted by an existing Farmwatch member, concerned for a dog he had purchased only days ago and which had been lost on Penistone Moor. Worth Valley NPT were only too happy to help with a Farmwatch alert to keep an eye out for the animal, which is also quite valuable. A Farmwatch alert was sent at 6.49pm and at 6.51pm we were contacted by a resident who had found the animal! A very grateful owner was reunited with his dog.

**SPEEDWATCH**

Following a small number of complaints a speed watch was carried out on Ebor Lane, junction Mytholmes Lane. From 10.30hrs 67 vehicles were checked over an hour in the 30mph zone. The highest speed was 25mph, and an average of 19mph, both obviously well below the speed limit. The second speed watch was carried out in Oakworth in the 30mph zone as vehicles enter the village along Keighley Road. From 14.30hrs approximately 160 vehicles were checked only three were exceeding the speed limit, the highest speed was 38mph, and the average was about 28mph.

#### **Seasonal crime reduction advice**

Whilst the Worth Valley is a low crime area, with the clocks going back and nights getting darker, burglaries historically increase around this time of the year. We're asking residents to help us maintain our low crime levels by following this basic crime prevention advice :-

##### **Leave a light on**

**Leave a light on inside the house - choose well-used rooms such as the lounge or bedroom, not a hallway or other largely unused area.**

**Timer switches are an excellent way of triggering one or more lights. Occupied houses will normally have more than one light on.**

##### **Use lighting outside the house**

**Fit low energy dusk to dawn lights. They are both cheap to install and cheap to run. They will lighten up any areas that would be burglars could use to hide.**

##### **Other safety tips:**

**Keep your door locked when you are at home and when you go out.**

**Always keep car keys, and other valuables, out of sight and certainly away from windows and doors.**

**Make sure your locks are of a good British Standard.**

**If you have a burglar alarm, use it.**

##### **Draw your curtains at night**

Sergeant Chris Watson said "When it starts to get darker, burglars can easily spot unoccupied houses without any lights on. Often, people are not home from work until a couple of hours after it's gone dark.

The simple precaution of leaving lights on or using a timer switch can make the difference between your house being targeted by burglars, or it being left alone."
